


Everyone makes mistakes and commits sins. This psalm teaches us a way to tell God we are sorry and to pray for forgiveness.

Follow the path and draw divisions between the words.





Regathering the Church

Our church exists glorify God by being disciples of Jesus Christ who make disciples through gospel-centered worship, fellowship, service, and engagement.

The COVID-19 outbreak hasn't changed our purpose, but it has impacted the way our purpose is carried out. God has providentially hindered our ability to meet together as a body since March 15, 2020. We do not understand why God has brought these circumstances upon the global church at this time, but we continue to trust in His goodness. (Romans 8:28)

As society begins to slowly re-open and we communally adjust to the new normal, churches are now faced with difficult decisions. We long to be together. Online and drive-in worship is helpful, but it is not the same as a normal gathering of the body of Christ.

Three words have served to guide our regathering strategy: **biblical**, **honorable**, **and safe**.

BIBLICAL It is true that we are the church when we are scattered, but we're certainly called to gather. Biblically, the gathering of the church is essential for a local congregation to fulfill its mission.

HONORABLE Our local government has asked that we observe certain restrictions on gathering. These restrictions are aimed at stopping the spread of COVID-19. Honoring our government is a way we express our obedience to God (Romans 13). Therefore, we want to do everything in our power to ensure we're honoring the requests of our government at this time.

SAFE We are obligated to protect one another. We have elected not to gather for the past several weeks to protect the health of our congregation and our community. We're taking extra precautions as we regather so that we can safeguard the health of our FBC Family.





Regathering the Church

May 17, 24, 31

Drive-In/Outdoor Worship & Livestream We are continuing to hold services outdoors on these three Sundays as we prepare to reopen our facility for gatherings.

Limited Indoor Gathering & Livestream

We will replace outdoor worship with an indoor gathering in our gym/fellowship hall. This will be a worship service only with no childcare/children's church.

Limited Gathering Plan

General Guidelines

We encourage everyone in the FBC Family to continue following Missouri's Show Me Strong Recovery Plan to protect yourself and others:

- Stay home if you don't feel well
- Wash hands often or use hand sanitizer
- Avoid touching your face
- Sneeze or cough into a tissue or the inside your elbow
- Disinfect frequently used items and surfaces
- Avoid socializing in groups that do not readily allow for appropriate social distancing
- Minimize travel to the extent possible

Limited Gathering Guidelines

We'll begin meeting in the FBC gym/fellowship hall on **June 7.** This gathering will look different, but we'll be able be together. Here are some of the precautions we're taking to ensure we gather Biblically, honorably, and safely.

- If you don't feel safe coming to a public gathering, please do not feel guilty for staying home during this phase of our recovery plan.
- We will not be offering childcare or children's church.
- We will not be having our regular Family Fellowship with coffee and pastries. No coffee will be served, but you're welcome to bring your own.
- Please maintain 6-feet between yourself and anyone who is not part of your household.
- A welcome team will greet people on the sidewalk. All doors entering the facility will remain open to decrease people touching doorknobs. The welcome team will avoid handshakes and hugs. However, they will offer smiles, waves, friendliness, and encouragement.

Limited Gathering Guidelines (cont.)

- Digital versions of the bulletin and sermon notes will be made available online.
- We will not be passing an offering plate. A secure box will be available for you to make a donation to the church.
- Chairs will be set up in 'pods' (groups of 3-10) throughout the worship area. Please do not sit with individuals who are not members of your household.
- A volunteer team will be sanitizing all common surfaces (doorknobs, chairs, restrooms, etc) following all gatherings.
- Attendees will be directed to enter through the fellowship hall doors on Collier Street and exit through the gym doors on Sneed Street to minimize incidental contact.

 - Women's Bible Study (Zoom): Thursday at 7pm
- Under the current health department order, holding gatherings in classrooms at FBC is not possible. We look forward to resuming in-person small group classes as soon as it is practical.
